I. TIME TRIALS AND ROAD RACES

Czech-Slovak National Record: Prague-Bratislava-Prague, 820 kilometers (road construction route) 43 hours, 45 minutes (Oct. 2004)

Spanish National Record: Race Across Spain, Tarifa to San Sebastián, 744 miles/1200 kilometers, 55 hours, 10 minutes (Nov. 2002)

Spanish National Record: Race Across Spain, Tarifa to San Sebastián, 775 miles/1250 kilometers, 59 hours, 23 minutes (July 2002)

Third Place: Cochise County Cycling Classic, (Tucson, Arizona) 252 miles/408 kilometers (longest road race in the United States)(Oct. 1998)

American National Record: Race Across California, East to West, 248 miles/402 kilometers, 12 hours, 57 minutes (May 1996)

American National Record: 12 Hours on Road (Portsmouth, England) 264.7 miles/429 kilometers (May 1995)

Co-Champion: Cochise County Cycling Classic, 252 miles/408 kilometers (Oct. 1994)

American National Record: San Francisco to Los Angeles, California, 402 miles/646.82 kilometers, 21 hours, 12 minutes (May 1994)

World Record and Champion: Race Across AMERICA (RAAM), 3000 miles/4860 kilometers, from Los Angeles to New York, 8 days, 8 hours, 45 minutes (Aug. 1989)

Champion: John Marino Open, 552 miles/894 kilometers, RAAM qualifying race, from Tucson, Arizona to Flagstaff, Arizona and back (Apr. 1987)

World Record: 100 Miles (160.9 kilometers) (May 1993)
